7 Novice Any instrument	You must not yet be performing Grade 1 pieces. This class is for those who have only been playing for a short time. The expectation is that they will not yet be performing Grade 1 pieces.  In this class you may select to play the same short piece twice - once to calm the nerves and once for performance. The adjudicator will judge the best performance of the two.	Your performance should last no longer than 4 minutes.  You should dress as you would for a concert performance. (Dress to impress).		
8 Woodwind 9 Brass 10 Strings 11 Piano	For ALL instrumentalists who are performing Grade 1 and above pieces.  You must play one single piece of music - not two short pieces.	Smile and be confident.  It is okay if you need to stop and start again.		
12 Primary duets and trios	For ALL instrumentalists who are performing Grade 1 and above pieces.	Remember to take a bow at the end.		
	You must play one single piece of music - not two short pieces.
