WHICH VOCAL CLASS SHOULD I ENTER?

In all classes:-

The adjudicator will be looking for:

Accuracy - of pitch and rhythm.

Communication - your involvement in your performance.

Interpretation - are you following the composer's intentions in terms of tempo and performance directions?

In a group - are you balanced, in time, in tune and working with each other?

REMEMBER

- Smile and be confident.
- Take a bow at the end.
- IT IS OKAY TO STOP AND START AGAIN IF YOU NEED TO.
- You may introduce your piece with the title and composer or ask for it to be announced for you. (you will not be marked down for this).
